Prevention and Screening

- In 2012 the realignment of breast, cervical and colorectal cancer screening to facilitate moving to a regional Integrated Cancer Screening Program under Prevention and Screening Services at TBRHSC.
- In 2013 the launch of the new Screen for Life mobile screening coach which offers all three organized screening programs to regional sites and within Thunder Bay.

Survivorship

- WE-Can (Wellness & Exercise program for individuals with Cancer).
- Proving to be successful in increasing functional capacity and quality of life for individuals who are currently in active treatment or up to five years post-treatment.
- The program offers supervision by certified exercise professionals, individualized exercise programs in a safe, private, small group environment and provides participants with a social support network with others like them.

Palliative Care Program

 Introduction of PleurX Program. The PleurX® pleural system is a tunneled catheter inserted in patients who have recurrent fluid buildup in their lungs from cancer. This fluid buildup causes patients tremendous discomfort, is associated with recurrent hospitalizations as well as visits to the emergency departments and unscheduled visits to the cancer centre.

Outpatient Clinic Environment

- New electronic health record improves safety, quality and regional coordination.
- In May of 2013, the new Electronic Medical Record (EMR) MOSAIQ was introduced in the outpatient Cancer Centre. Used by physicians and nurses at the point of care, the EMR has improved efficiencies in the clinic. Less reliance on a paper chart has improved the coordination of care and information among the health care team. Patient safety is enhanced through features of the EMR, such as care plans and quality check lists for standard procedures. Chemotherapy nurses across the region are able to document in a standardized way in the EMR.

Aboriginal Patient Navigator

 The Aboriginal Patient Navigator's role is to promote timely access to palliative and supportive care, which begins at the time of cancer diagnosis (when cancer has been identified), and to work to ensure seamless, coordinated care and services by assisting cancer patients and their families in navigating the cancer system.

Radiation Treatment Advances

 Two new state-of-the-art Linear Accelerators that provide the most advanced Image Guided Radiation Therapy (IGRT) available and enable the delivery of the latest in external radiation beam treatment techniques including Volumetric Modulated Arc Therapy (VMAT) and Stereotactic Body Radiation Therapy (SBRT).
