● Stroke Prevention Clinics

Stroke prevention clinics promote continuity of care between acute care facilities, the patient, their family and caregivers, and their primary care providers. All Prevention Clinics require a referral to obtain an appointment.

Secondary Stroke Prevention Clinic

This clinic addresses stroke prevention in a coordinated and interprofessional manner based on best practices. The focus is on investigation to determine possible causes of TIA / stroke. In addition, educates patients regarding lifestyle changes to modify risk factors for stroke.

Patients who experience a transient ischemic attack (TIA) or stroke are seen by a neurologist, nurse practitioner and dietitian.
