Library Access

The Library is accessible 24 hours per day/7 days per week with ID card access. Online library resources are available from computer workstations throughout the hospital.

Scrubs

Are available in the locker rooms and are stamped with "NOSM/TBRHSC". These must remain on site. When you are finished with them, please leave in designated areas in the locker rooms for cleaning. If none are available in your size, please call the Academic Affairs office.

I.D. Badge and Parking

Each medical student and resident will be issued an I.D. badge for identification purposes and hospital door access. Medical students will display their badge on a RED lanyard, Physician Assistants on ORANGE, and Residents use GREEN. All lanvards are provided by Academic Affairs. Parking can be added to your badge if required once proof of payment is provided to Security. You can pay for parking on a monthly basis at our Patient Billings department located across the hall from the information desk. Hours are 7:30 am - 8:30 pm Monday to Friday and 9:00 am -5:00 pm Saturday and Sunday. Monthly parking is \$34.00 for students and is unlimited from the 1-31 of the month. Daily parking is \$7.00 per day. All parking is in Lot I.

Lockers

Are available upon request from either Jane Varley or Karen Anderson. Locker rooms are located on the 1st floor – room 1551 for men and room 1558 for women.

Bike Racks

Located outside of the Renal Department (Golf Links Road) or outside of the Cafeteria doors. (East entrance)

Food Services

Our cafeteria is located on the first floor and is open Monday - Friday 7 am - 6:30 pm and Saturday & Sunday 9 am - 6:15 pm. Robins Donuts is located near the main entrance. There are also vending machines located in all major patient waiting areas.

Photocopying

If required in the hospital, access code for the photocopiers is "9938". Photocopiers are located in the library and in the Academic Affairs office.

Learners Lounge

Needlestick Injury

If you do happen to get a needlestick injury, please see your family doctor right away or if after hours or you do not have a family doctor, please go to the emergency department. Needlestick injury packages are located in all patient care areas or in the learners lounge in the bottom right hand side of the mailboxes. Please follow all instructions carefully. Dress Code

Photo I.D. must be worn at all times and be visible

NO scented products to be worn

Hair must be neat and clean, shoulder length and longer hair must be clipped back and off of the face

Facial Hair must be trimmed and clean keeping in mind that personal protective equipment must not be compromised

Nails are to be kept short. No artificial nails or nail polish to be worn when providing direct patient care

Jewelry is limited to a Medic-Alert, plain solid band (ring) and small post type studs.

Footwear must be well fitted with sole made of non-slip material and heal no more than 5 cm in height. Shoe must have fully enclosed toe and upper and heel if activity involves significant walking. Shoe material must be durable and impermeable to protect from chemicals, hot liquids or sharps.
